Details:

WHO: All 9-12th grade students and graduates.

WHAT: Mission trip that trains you to be on mission!

WHEN: June 27-July 2, 2022

WHERE: Colorado Christian University – Denver, CO

WHY: To expand the Kingdom of God!

HOW MUCH: \$1,000 / Includes: lodging, transportation, food, ministry fees, fun day, and t-shirt

NOTE: If you attended LTC in the past, you would attend the Core 201 track this time which takes students deeper in their faith, their ability to share the Gospel and in growing as disciple-makers and leaders.

Local SERVE Mission Weekend 2022

Details:

WHO: All 6-12th grade students and graduates

WHAT: Relational & Community Service Work Groups

WHEN: July 15-17

WHERE: Becker, MN

WHY: To expand the Kingdom of God!

HOW MUCH: \$100 / Includes: lodging, transportation, food, ministry fees and t-shirt

Mission Meetings:

Students are expected to attend mandatory mission meetings that pertain to the trip they have registered for. Dates to be determined.

College Credit for Attending LTC DENVER:

Students can earn 3 college credits from Colorado Christian University! But, you must register to do so. Registration opens in April and closes in June so mark your calendar and get registered online!

Fundraising Commitment:

Students are expected to attend and participate in Fundraising. Our biggest fundraiser is ONE NIGHT IN TUSCANY. Students must participate by helping set up, cook, serve guests, babysitting, clean up and more in order to acquire funds from the event.

If you create and make a silent auction basket to be used in the silent auction, the payment for your silent auction basket/item will go directly to your account.

Families helping ask companies and businesses for donations to the silent auction are greatly appreciated. Those silent auction item proceeds will be distributed equally to each student as those companies and businesses are supporting the trip and not the individual.

GET CREATIVE, CREATE SOME BASKETS, but make sure the silent auction items/baskets are at the church no later than Wednesday, February 9th.

Payment Due Dates:

While we will be fundraising, we have a guideline for due dates.

LTC DUE DATES:

1. February 1st: \$100 non-refundable deposit along with application and registration
2. March 15th: Account should be at \$300.
3. April 15th: Account should be at \$700.
4. May 15th: Account should be paid in full \$1,000.

MN DUE DATES:

1. March 1st: \$50 deposit along with application and registration.
2. July 1st: Account should be at \$150.

We have to stick to these dates, as we have registrations and obligations to meet. It is very important that all students attend the fundraisers to ensure that funds are raised!!!

Policy Agreement

I agree to follow the outlined policies as a mission trip member in accordance with BBC Students Ministries:

1. As a representative of Jesus Christ, my church, my country of residence, and BBC Students, I will behave at all times in a manner that brings glory and honor to these institutions.
2. I am aware that my every word and action is being watched during the entire mission trip experience. Therefore, I agree to act and talk in a manner that glorifies the name of Jesus Christ. I want everything I do or say to draw people to Jesus.

3. I will be spiritually, physically, and mentally prepared for a mission trip that will stretch me and mold me in ways that I can only imagine. I will do everything I can ahead of time to prepare myself for a “trip of a lifetime.”
4. I am a guest in the location I am visiting. I will respect and follow the traditions of the local people and nationals. For example, if the way I dress offends them, I will change. If I am offered food, I will take it with a “thank you” and a smile.
5. I will not criticize the culture, efficiency, work habits, food, traditions, etc. with which I come in contact. I have come not to judge, but to learn and to share the person of Jesus through my words, actions, and deeds.
6. I will respect and follow the BBC Students leaders and Lead THE Cause Trip Leaders and their decisions.
7. I agree to have a servant attitude at all times. When I am doing a task or ministry I don’t particularly care for, I will put my best foot forward and be a witness in this activity and in everything I will participate in while on the trip.
8. I will use words that encourage and build up my team members and the nationals at all times. This means I will refrain from gossip or words that bring dissension and take focus away from the goals of the trip.
9. I will have a positive attitude at all times. Every trip has its challenges and unforeseen circumstances. People could get sick, items lost, and plans changed. I realize that there are times I will need to “roll with the punches” and look at challenges as opportunities to be a witness for Jesus Christ.
10. I will work with all members of the team. I will refrain from pursuing romantic relationships during the trip. If my spouse or significant other is on the trip with me, I will make every effort to spend time with each person of the group and interact with all team members.
11. I will attend all team meetings and fulfill the responsibilities I have agreed to before, during, and after the trip. If I am not able to attend a meeting, I will be in contact with Pastor Kevin or my Group Leader as to what I missed.
12. I will not talk negatively about politics during the trip.
13. I will abstain from using, consuming, or possessing alcohol, tobacco products, and illegal drugs while on the trip.
14. I will not steal or commit any crime or do anything illegal while on the trip.
15. I will meet all medical, logistical, and legal travel requirements.
16. I will follow the travel, supply, clothing, financial, medical guidelines, etc. set forth and explained to me prior to the trip. I am responsible for knowing and following everything in the LTC Handbook and explained at the group meetings.
17. If I break any of the policies listed above, at the discretion of a Lead THE Cause representative, and in conjunction with my BBC Students Group Leader, my mission trip can be terminated, and I can be sent home at my own expense. I realize that to attend this trip and represent Jesus Christ on the mission field is a privilege and if I abuse that privilege this constitutes the right for my trip to end prematurely.
