NOTE: If you attended LTC in the past, you would attend the Core 201 track this time which takes students deeper in their faith, their ability to share the Gospel and in growing as disciple-makers and leaders.

Mission Meetings:

Students are expected to attend mandatory mission meetings. Schedule below.

College Credit for Attending LTC DENVER:

Students can earn 3 college credits from Colorado Christian University! But, you must register online to do so ON YOUR OWN. See PK for more information.

Fundraising Commitment:

Students are expected to attend and participate in our One Night in Tuscany Fundraiser on February 12th. Students must participate in some way (set up, cooking, serving, babysitting, clean up, etc.) in order to acquire funds from the event.

Families can help by asking companies and businesses for donations to our silent auction or by creating a silent auction basket yourself. Silent auction proceeds will be distributed to student's mission accounts. GET CREATIVE, CREATE SOME BASKETS, but make sure the silent auction items/baskets are at the church no later than Wednesday, February 9th.

Payment Due Dates:

While we will be fundraising, we have a guideline for due dates.

LTC DUE DATES:

1. Submit application to PK no later than February 1st. Informational meeting for parents and students will be held on February 1st at 7pm at The HUB.
2. On February 6th, team members will be notified and a \$100 non-refundable deposit will be due at this time to reserve your spot.
2. March 15th: Account should be at \$300.
3. April 15th: Account should be at \$700.
4. May 15th: Account should be paid in full \$1,000.

We have to stick to these dates, as we have registrations and obligations to meet. It is very important that all students attend the fundraisers to ensure that funds are raised!!!

BBC Students Policy Agreement

I agree to follow the outlined policies as a mission trip member in accordance with BBC Students Ministries:

1. As a representative of Jesus Christ, my church, my hometown, and BBC Students, I will behave at all times in a manner that brings glory and honor to these institutions.
2. I am aware that my every word and action is being watched during the entire trip experience. Therefore, I agree to act and talk in a manner that glorifies the name of Jesus Christ. I want everything I do or say to draw people to Jesus.
3. I will be spiritually, physically, and mentally prepared for a trip that will stretch me and mold me in ways that I can only imagine. I will do everything I can ahead of time to prepare myself for a "trip of a lifetime."
4. I am a guest in the location I am visiting. I will respect and follow the traditions of the local people. For example, if the way I dress offends them, I will change. If I am offered food, I will take it with a "thank you" and a smile.
5. I will not criticize the culture, efficiency, work habits, food, traditions, etc. with which I come in contact. I have come not to judge, but to learn and to share the person of Jesus through my words, actions, and deeds.
6. I will respect and follow the BBC Students leaders and Lead THE Cause Trip Leaders and their decisions.
7. I agree to have a servant attitude at all times. When I am doing a task or ministry I don't particularly care for, I will put my best foot forward and be a witness in this activity and in everything I will participate in while on the trip.
8. I will use words that encourage and build up my team members and the locals at all times. This means I will refrain from gossip or words that bring dissension and take focus away from the goals of the trip.
9. I will have a positive attitude at all times. Every trip has its challenges and unforeseen circumstances. People could get sick, items lost, and plans changed. I realize that there are times I will need to "roll with the punches" and look at challenges as opportunities to be a witness for Jesus Christ.
10. I will work with all members of the team. I will refrain from pursuing romantic relationships during the trip. If my spouse or significant other is on the trip with me, I will make every effort to spend time with each person of the group and interact with all team members.
11. I will attend all team meetings and fulfill the responsibilities I have agreed to before, during, and after the trip. If I am not able to attend a meeting, I will be in contact with Pastor Kevin as to what I missed.
12. I will not talk negatively about politics during the trip.
13. I will abstain from using, consuming, or possessing alcohol, tobacco products, and illegal drugs while on the trip.
14. I will not steal or commit any crime or do anything illegal while on the trip.
15. I will follow the travel, supply, clothing, financial, medical guidelines, etc. set forth and explained to me prior to the trip. I am responsible for knowing and following everything in the LTC Handbook and explained at the group meetings.
16. If I break any of the policies listed above, at the discretion of a Lead THE Cause representative, and in conjunction with my BBC Students Group Leader, my mission trip can be terminated, and I can be sent home at my own expense. I realize that to attend this trip and represent Jesus Christ on the mission field is a privilege and if I abuse that privilege this constitutes the right for my trip to end prematurely.

Lead The Cause TEAM COMMITMENTS

1. TEAM TRAINING SCHEDULE.

The LTC Team Training schedule is shown on a separate sheet. Each training session is designed to address significant growth areas in your spiritual walk, to learn new principles in following Jesus, to develop how you can communicate the Gospel and Biblical truths, and to help develop and grow our team unity. It will also include hands-on opportunities to use what they are learning. We need to impress upon both the students applying and their parents who are helping them evaluate this opportunity to know that we take the training schedule seriously and believe it is one of the most important parts of the process. *Team members will be expected to attend these meetings unless you have talked with Pastor Kevin prior and obtain missed materials. You could be dismissed from the team if you do not comply.*

2. TEAM TRAINING CONTENT.

The team will be asked to do a variety of things in training for our mission together. The team will be trained in prayer, discipleship, evangelism, and leadership principles, which they will then use during our time in Denver and for the rest of their lives. The team will be asked to maintain the daily aspects of our walk with God. The team will work to write and know their testimony, to memorize an outline to share the Gospel, and memorize key Bible verses that go with the outline. The team will also be given assignments that will be practical applications between meetings, and we may even read a book on evangelism and discipleship. We want to encourage parents to help students to know how to plan out their time effectively. Our desire is for the training to both prepare and stretch students for the trip and the rest of their lives.

3. TEAM GUIDELINE.

We have found that it is helpful to let applicants and parents know that students are allowed to bring their cell phones to LTC because the LTC organization will give the students ways to leverage technology for the Kingdom of God. Our desire is to be connected as a team, therefore we expect students and leaders to not be consumed by their phone. The team leaders will manage the group to ensure safety throughout the trip. Students will have the opportunity to communicate with parents during the trip. We also ask that students commit to dressing appropriately on the trip.
